FORUM BACKGROUND:

Located west of the town of Beaudesert, Bromelton has long been identified as having the potential to develop as a significant industrial node for South East Queensland and gateway to broader domestic and international markets.

In 2008 the Queensland Government declared the Bromelton State Development Area (SDA), covering approximately 15,000 hectares, to promotes economic development by providing for the growing demand for greenfield land in South East Queensland which is suitable for medium to large scale industrial activities.

With access to the standard gauge rail network along the Melbourne to Brisbane rail corridor, Bromelton is an ideal location for intermodal freight and logistics operations as well as "hard to locate" or "large footprint" industries.

SCT Logistics, with support from the Federal Government and Scenic Rim Regional Council, has invested \$30million to construct an intermodal freight facility within the Bromelton SDA. The 130 hectare site is located beside Beaudesert-Boonah Road, will have direct rail access to the Port of Brisbane and Inland Rail (once built) and is serviced by B-double transport routes.



Operational in January 2017, the SCT intermodal freight facility will stimulate economic development in the region, providing door to door domestic railhaul line services between Melbourne to Brisbane; rail shuttle services to the Port of Brisbane; and industrial warehousing and property solutions.

Further development of the Bromelton transport and logistics hub is set to continue with the Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) recently purchasing nearly 850 hectares of land adjacent to the SCT facility.

Beyond the Bromelton site, key infrastructure and services are being planned and developed to improve rail and road access, efficiency and productivity.

Stakeholders are encouraged to consider how the opportunities arising from unprecedented development in the greater Bromelton region can benefit their business.
