WHO ARE WE?

The Queensland Transport and Logistics Council is a cooperative advisory body that provides advice to stakeholders, on the planning, regulation, development and operation of freight and logistics transport, infrastructure and services in Queensland. QTLC provides a policy forum for all members industry and government to collaborate on achieving freight efficiencies and productivity gains throughout Queensland's road, rail, sea and air freight network.

WHAT DO WE DO?

QTLC supports the efficient movement of freight, a sustainable, productive and economic viable industry and prosperity for Queenslanders by pursuing:

- investment in supply chain infrastructure
- industry and government collaboration to increase utility of the network
- integrated regional and urban planning frameworks that consider future freight land use
- an access policy and regulatory environment that facilitates productivity and innovation
- a safe working environment
- efficient integration and linkage of freight and logistics systems across the whole supply chain.

The QTLC works towards operational and strategic solutions to impediments and issues within the freight supply chain with both long term and immediate benefits for industry.

VALUE PROPOSITION

The breadth and depth of knowledge of QTLC stakeholders and the collective networks they can tap into is QTLC value proposition. This key characteristic ensures that stakeholders in the freight industry are listened to collectively; with a greater responsiveness to issues because of shortened communication lines; and a higher level of influence through collaboration; leading to strategic outcomes and results.

FUNDING
